Examining the Four Gospels : Christian Courier Mark was the son of a woman named Mary (Acts 12:12) and the cousin of the evangelist Barnabas (Col. 4:10). Apparently, Mark had a close relationship with Peter (1 Pet. 5:13), and there is considerable evidence that he wrote his Gospel account under the influence of that apostle. The Gospel of Mark is remarkably different from that of Matthew. Synoptic means "same view" or "seeing together," and by that definition, these three books cover much the same subject matter and treat it in similar ways.
